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
















NAi CHINA PROGRAM 2011年荷兰建筑协会中国项目

Organized by the Netherlands Architecture Institute (NAi), this three day workshop brings together Dutch and Chinese architects in order to explore common grounds and differences between Chinese and Dutch design on social/low-cost/lowrent/affordable housing in China.

Since 2008, the topic of affordable [lowcost, low-income] housing has been prominent on China's construction agenda. The importance of finding new solutions for China's housing sector is directly related to the discussion about, and the unease with, the rise in housing prizes in all of China's cities.

The need and demand for affordable housing in China is a real one. It is a demand where one can put, in 2011, a number on: 10 million units are needed and will, probably, be constructed all over China this year.

A crucial part of the NAi CHINA HOUSING WORKSHOP was to explore both ideal and realistic scenario's for the future development of the Xianghe-project, as well as to find cultural and architectonical common ground between Dutch and Chinese architects on the issue of social and affordable housing.

Ole Bouman, director of the NAi, put forward following key points for the workshop: explore working methods, determine the approach, discuss spatial organization, talk about living conditions and social circumstances, develop a script and future opportunities. This document is a sum-up of ideas, thoughts and visions launched by Dutch and Chinese architects during the three-day workshop.

The question Mr. Mao Daqing (VANKE Executive Vice President, President of Beijing VANKE), placed forward was how architectural practices can add value to the development of affordable housing in China.

Overall, the uncertainty of future development of the Xianghe masterplan was understood as an opportunity to replan and rethink the area.



























After the presentation by VANKE Beijing, the question determining the direction of the group discussion was if we really want this workshop to be an experiment with focus on social housing – and that on a strategically interesting location. Acknowledging the existing programmatic and contextual gap between affordable and commercial housing, can one positively approach this issue of social housing as a "temporal problem" demanding short-term solutions but no long-term vision?

This leads to another question: what to do 15 years from now and can this workshop be an exercise in developing housing prototypes that can be applied in other contexts, or at various scales?

Next to this, community structure is considered of utmost importance: how to make a community coherent and diverse? In the case of Xianghe this might mean to think how the existing community – currently living and working on the site of intervention – can further develop and/or be rebuild in a new masterplan?











During the two intense workshop days the Dutch and Chinese architects were divided in four mixed groups. A series of alternating group and collective brainstorms were key for the development of ideas, scenarios and critiques.














































GROUP 1

Investigated the idea of a "social wall" as the identity for the Xianghe-project. Social housing was used "to save the commercial housing", in the form of 'back-to-back' social and commercial housing typologies.

GROUP 2

Followed a bottom-up strategy, focusing on the existing three villages in the Xiangheplot. This led to the idea of bringing in social housing by departing from rebuilding the morphology of traditional villages.

GROUP 3

Explored the notion of flexible planning, so social housing and residential blocks and parks can be organized and designed with the possibility to grow and shrink.


GROUP 4

Social housing as part of city-making "on the move". Further concerns were expressed over the cost, quality and minimal standard for social and affordable housing. What is the 'minimal' possible in this context?






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APRIL 2011 NAI CHINA workshop

After a morning of group discussion, a collective debate followed, firstly with the objective to write a mission statement. In itself, the notion of a possible manifesto was questioned, but no actual replacement for this word was found.

These questions were further explored in the afternoon through a hands-on approach and a series of quick sketches on top of the existing Xianghe-masterplan. A social housing hub, connecting commerce and housing with transport, could be seen as the heart of the new masterplan. Besides, the area and project could become a hotspot by combining leisure and urban farming - an ecological and community-centered approach.














Guidelines for a communal Dutch-Chinese position on the project at hand, and specifically on the social issues, could be based on following principles:

• No city without different social groups - all social groups must participate in the creation and evaluation of spatial concepts.

• Social housing as a desirable choice, and as a playground for exploration of sustainable developments - so to promote an active lifestyle and seek advanced ways of manufacturing housing units.

• What does social housing means in this context? Is it affordable housing in the context of Xianghe or a means to deal with affordable housing in 'bedroom communities' in general? Or are we dealing with tabula rasa social housing?


• Low-cost and social housing are not a threat to the quality of the Chinese housing program but an opportunity to enhance the quality of society.

• How to set up the architectural framework for the intervention and management of social housing in Xianghe?



















